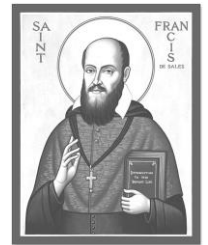

**An Opportunity to join the Permanent Diaconate:** Currently we have Permanent Deacons at work across the diocese in various ministries. But more are needed, and younger. Now is the time for men aged from 30 to 55 who are active in their parishes, and with a heart for those in need, to come and see how their existing life of service can be developed and more fully given for the life of the Church. Deacons are ordained to a public permanent ministry, while usually still in employment. Their talents, working life, as well as their family life (if married), all add to the life experiences they can bring into their ministry. This working and family experience, enhanced by the grace of ordination, places Deacons in a unique position to serve.

What is a Deacon? Deacons are a living icon of Christ the Servant within the Church. The ordained ministry of a Deacon has three parts: *Word*, that is proclaiming the gospel, preaching, and catechising. *Liturgy*, including service at the Altar, the solemn administration of Baptism, as an ordinary minister of the Eucharist, in blessings (including the blessing of Marriages) and as an ordinary minister for funerals. And in *Charity*. This pastoral role is exercised through encouragement and servant leadership in whatever may be needed within and beyond the community he serves.
